## 1. Overview

The Tuwhare Residency Programme is the first residency programme in Aotearoa New Zealand to be established in the name and home of a Māori writer.

## 2. Tuwhare Residency Programme Objectives

The objectives of the Tuwhare Residency Programme are:

- To acknowledge and celebrate the Hone Tuwhare legacy
- To support recipients to spend time at the Tuwhare crib
- To provide a platform for recipients to be ambassadors of the Hone Tuwhare legacy
- To support the literary and creative landscape of Aotearoa New Zealand.

## 3. Tuwhare Residencies

Three foundational residencies have been developed and together they form the Tuwhare Residency Programme.

- Te Pane Kākā o Tuwhare - The Hone Tuwhare Poetry Residency
- Te Ringatoi o Tuwhare - The Hone Tuwhare Creative Residency
- Te Kaituhi o Tuwhare - The Hone Tuwhare Creative Writers Residency

## Te Pane Kākā o Tuwhare - The Hone Tuwhare Poetry Residency

**Te Pane Kākā o Tuwhare residency** is for a Māori poet from Aotearoa New Zealand. The Tuwhare Trust is interested in supporting Māori poets who are emerging or already established writers. Applications are welcome from Māori poets who are preparing to publish new work or who have new projects to work on and would benefit from spending time at the Tuwhare crib.

### Residency Information:

- **Dates:** The dates for this residency are flexible. The successful recipient and the Tuwhare Trust will discuss dates for the residency as part of the agreed residency arrangement. The maximum stay is 4 weeks.
- **Where:** Kākā Point is located on The Catlins coast, approximately one hour's drive south of Ōtepoti Dunedin.
- **Stipend:** \$1,250 per week (GST included) up to 4 weeks maximum (\$5,000)
- **Travel:** Return flights to Dunedin are arranged and paid for by the Tuwhare Trust. Return travel from Dunedin to Kākā Point is also arranged and paid for by the Tuwhare Trust.
- **Accommodation:** The Tuwhare crib accommodation is provided. The Crib is a small one bedroom holiday crib. There is also a writing/creative studio space at the rear of the property.
- **Amenities:** You will have full use of the Tuwhare crib for the duration of your residency with access to Wi-fi and basic kitchen facilities.
- **During the residency:** The Tuwhare Trust can provide opportunities for the resident to meet with local writers and creatives in Ōtepoti Dunedin. This can be arranged between the recipient and the Trust.
- **Accessibility:** The Tuwhare crib is a modestly-sized home with steps at the entry, narrow doorways, a step into the bedroom and no accessible bathroom. Unfortunately, this means this residency is not suitable for wheelchair users. Similarly, the accommodation is up a steep incline. Please let us know if you have other accessibility needs and would like to know if this residency is suitable for you.
- **Conditions of the residency:**
  - Residencies are open to New Zealand citizens and permanent residents who live in Aotearoa.
  - You may only apply for one residency.
  - Applications for this residency will be assessed by the Hone Tuwhare Charitable Trust Board.
  - All applicants will be notified in writing on the outcome of their application.
  - The decision of the Board will be final and no correspondence or discussion will be entered into with unsuccessful applicants.
  - Applications will only be accepted via the correct email: [Tuwhare.Residency@gmail.com](mailto:Tuwhare.Residency@gmail.com) and prior to the deadline for applications.
  - Applications will not be returned to applicants.
  - The resident will engage in media to promote their Tuwhare residency.
  - The resident will sign an agreement with the Tuwhare Trust as part of their acceptance of the Tuwhare Residency.
